SoCalGas Update

This is to update you on our efforts to respond to the record-setting heat wave in Southern California.

SoCalGas is doing everything in our ability to support energy reliability throughout this heat wave. Through the past weekend and into this week, we are working in very close coordination with the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) and other agencies, as well as our electric generation customers, to monitor supply and adjust operations as needed to optimize reliability.

To reduce the strain on our energy systems through conservation, CAISO issued a Flex Alert at 10 a.m. today and it's expected to remain in effect until 9 p.m. this evening.

An emergency localized curtailment was issued by SDG&E beginning at 8:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 19, 2016, due to an outage of the Blythe compressor station. The curtailment affected certain electric generation customers in SDG&E's service territory, who had some limitations to gas usage during the curtailment and was not related to SoCalGas' Aliso Canyon. The curtailment was lifted at 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 20, 2016. However, a Gas Curtailment Watch for SoCalGas and SDG&E gas customers remains in effect.
